Business Meeting:

1. The meeting was called to order.
2. Reports:
  - Secretary: The minutes from the June 16, 2012 meeting were read and approved.
  - Treasurer: Since the last annual meeting receipts were \$3,975.00 and the expenses were \$9,726.53. Pending receipts from a grant from the Initiative Foundation is \$5000.00. The Treasurer's report was approved.
  - Membership: We have 196 members of which 26 are current.
3. Board actions:
  - Thank you to Karl Bell and Judy Miller who will be leaving the board. Their terms expire in 2013.
  - Mike Bury, Al Cote, Mark Johnson, Andy Levesque and Roy Srp were elected to the board.
  - Ken Neihart, Bob Stancer and Fred Strohmeier are current board members and their terms will expire in 2014.
4. Old business: none.
5. New Business: A brief overview of the Crow Wing County Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) that the FLPOA is participating in was given. This program places paid inspectors at the four public watercraft accesses in the city. The hourly rate is \$14.40 per hour. This year the association has received some grant money from the DNR and committed funds for approximately 210 hours of inspector time. As of July 26, 2013 the association has spent \$1,684.80 for 117 hours of inspector time.
6. There being no more business the meeting was adjourned.

Program:

1. Mellissa Barrick from the Crow Wing County Soil and Water Conservation District presented an overview of Mitchell Lake that included an update of the water quality and other comments.
2. Scott Lucus from the Brainerd office of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency provided some interesting information regarding the pending study of Kego Lake and discuss some good management practices to follow for lakeshore property owners.
