Hi Neighbors!

It was great seeing so many of you at the annual meeting. I wanted to get out a newsletter now that we have an update on donations collected so far this year as well as a date for the annual Meet-n-Greet at Dick and Diane Tracy's! I encourage everyone to attend, it is a lot of fun and a great chance to catch up with the neighbors!

Blue green algae warning

Minnesota Lakes and Rivers has issued a warning that the unusually warm temperatures have contributed to the appearance of blue-green algae in some lakes. The problem will increase as waters warm. Blooms can look like pea soup, green paint, or floating mats of scum and sometimes have a bad smell. Blooms aren't always large and dense; sometimes they only cover small portions of the lake or are suspended in the water and don't form a surface scum. Unfortunately, some of these blooms can produce toxins that are harmful to people and pets.

2017 Boat Inspection Recap

In 2017, Wright County staffed a total of 181 hours of boat inspection at Granite Lake public access. During this time, they completed 227 inspections with some interesting stats:

- 25% - 35% were Granite Lake regulars.
- 62 different lakes had been visited prior to Granite
- 1 was from out of state
- 2 drain plug violations

I find it most interesting (and somewhat alarming) that the boats entering Granite Lake have come from 62 other lakes! That is a lot of opportunity to introduce Aquatic Invasive species. Please keep in mind that these inspections were simple onsite visual inspections and only for a small fraction of the time boats enter Granite Lake.

2018 Boat Inspection: Wright Regional Inspection

Pilot(WRIP)

Wright County has initiated a 3 lake pilot program to perform mandatory inspections of all boats entering lakes Sylvania, John, and Pleasant. Boats will have to go to a separate inspection facility and receive a tag as proof that they passed inspection. Boats and trailers will be checked and anyone without a tag could be fined. Granite Lake Watershed Association voted to put our lake on the wait list to join this program if and when it is expanded to additional lakes. We are optimistic that this approach will be more successful than the spot inspections that have been done in the past.

Granite Lake Outflow Project

As you know Granite Lake has many inflows of surface water entering the lake, but only a single outflow. Therefore, properly maintaining this outflow in the Southwest portion of our watershed is crucial to the overall water level of our lake. Lake levels have been high for years resulting in frequent and persistent no wake zones. Therefore, our association has been actively monitoring this area. In recent years we removed a beaver dam and cleared out fallen trees and other debris to allow water to take its natural path out of Granite Lake, under County Road 5 and into the North Fork Crow River. Again this year, a determined and hardworking crew were back for another cleanup effort to clear additional fallen branches and trees. Many thanks to this crew for their hard work to keep the water flowing!

Also in this area there are plans with Wright County Soil and Water to replace the culvert under Count Road 5. We don't have timing on this yet, but watch for more updates.

Park Update

Jim & Mary Schwebel have continued their amazing generosity – continuing to lease the park area to Granite Lake Watershed Association and donating for continued improvements to the park.

The progress has continued right through the winter. Multiple loads of sand have been delivered for the beach and the final foundation from the original “cabins” has been removed. This summer's list of planned improvements include the addition of a pedestrian bridge over the stream so that the children (and adults) can experience the joy of watching nature as the water flows underneath the bridge.

NO DUES/NO WAIVER....NO PARK!

Just a reminder, this is a private park and only those current with dues and have signed waivers on file are allowed to use the new Park. This is a provision of our lease and required by our insurance company! Attached to this newsletter is a copy of the waiver that must be signed by you and your guests and emailed to (timwaldschmidt3@gmail.com) or mailed to Tim at 2309 Kimball Ave NW, Annandale, MN 55302, before entering the property. Please email or text Tim at 612-325-8042 with any questions, comments or concerns. He will give you the code for the gate after signed waivers received. Note: Please lock the gate and scramble numbers each time you enter/exit via the road. You will also be able to reserve the Park for a reunion, graduation, or family gathering. If that date is open, the BBQ grill, picnic tables, and game area will be for your use. The beach and dock are always open to other members. Members cannot reserve the park during holidays such as 4th of July, Labor Day weekend, etc. \$150 refundable deposit required.

Aquatic Invasive Species

Eurasian Water Milfoil

Our Eurasian water milfoil treatments have been very successful! The 2017 lake survey found only half an acre of treatable milfoil! This is tremendous progress from the 2014 survey which identified over 20 acres of Eurasian Water Milfoil!

The 2017 cost was offset by grants received from the DNR (\$450) and Wright County (\$576) leaving our remaining cost at \$576.

The association will do another AIS survey this year and treat based upon those results.



Zebra Mussel Monitoring

Zebra mussels have been found in nearby lakes. However, we are happy to report that **NO zebra mussels have been found in Granite Lake!** The Zebra Mussel monitoring kits were inspected this summer by Scott and Gretchen Quiggle and fortunately, no signs of zebra mussel were found. We encourage you to stay vigilant as early detection of zebra mussels is extremely important if we are to have a chance to address an issue in our lake. Many thanks to Scott and Gretchen for their frequent inspections throughout the summer.

It is important to follow these steps to prevent the spread of zebra mussels and other invasive species to Granite Lake.

- If you buy a used dock, lift, or boat you must check it for zebra mussels and Eurasian Water Milfoil before putting it in Granite Lake. The DNR also specifies:
 - Spraying the used equipment with high-pressure water;
 - Rinsing with hot water (120 degrees for two minutes, or 140 degrees for 10 seconds); or
 - Drying the equipment for at least five days (note that “best current science” suggests 21-29 days dry).



Starry Stonewort



Starry Stonewort is another AIS that is in nearby lakes. This is the worst of the current AIS threats. It spreads quickly and is very difficult to treat. Again, we are fortunate to **not** have this in our lake, but please keep alert for this as well and let us know if you see it on your equipment or in the lake.

Individual Lake Shore Treatments

Just a reminder that individual lake shore owners may still want to do additional treatments to prepare their immediate space for various recreational uses. There are many additional weeds; algae; swimmers itch; muck and other conditions that the association does not treat. We encourage you to get the appropriate permit and treat your individual lakeshore to meet your own goals. We are using PLM for our AIS management and they are also available for individual needs.
