RE: Bogs

Dear Lake Alexander Riparian Land Owner,

Despite frequent notices in our newsletter and voiced at our annual meetings it is indeed unfortunate that we have to contact our lake neighbors concerning certain unacceptable behavior relating to bogs on Lake Alexander.

It has come to our attention that some of us have been contacting (to say it politely) our vendor demanding that a bog(s) be removed from their property at Lake Alexander Lake Improvement District (LALID) expense. Only LALID board members have been authorized to contact our vendor and no one else is to run up the public's tab for their own personal expense. The LALID board reserves the right to further assess property owners and/or take other legal action (including punitive damages) as necessary.

The LALID is not your insurance policy against property damage. If you are concerned about damage to your shoreline and equipment then please contact your property insurance agent or be prepared to cover your own expenses personally including any related insurance deductible amount.

If you should have a bog larger than 30 square feet (approximate size of a pick up truck bed) that you wish to have addressed then please use courtesy and contact a LALID board member.

Bogs smaller than 30 square feet may be either left alone or you may stake in place or remove them personally. If you move a bog you legally become responsible for it and any associated damage it causes.

If you have any further enquiries or are unsure of what our Bog Removal/Moving process is, feel free to contact any one of our LID Board members for clarification.
