

Lake Shamineau Lake Improvement District (LSLID) Meeting between the Shamineau LID and the Crookneck LID

June 1, 2018

Welcome/Intro

1. Welcome and Introductions

Bob Koll welcomed the group at 1 PM and each Board member introduced themselves. Bob noted that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the mutual water problems between the lakes. Bob also stated that the goal of the Lake Shamineau LID (LSLID) project is to establish a consistent water level to a maximum elevation. Bob also noted that there may be benefits to Crookneck Lake property owners with the lowering of Lake Shamineau.

2. Lake Shamineau High Water

Rick noted the current and historical water levels and the intent to pump water to about 1 foot below the OWL. It was noted that Crookneck Lake currently is about 2 feet above the OWL. He also noted that the operating plan and pumping will take into consideration downstream property owners and effect on Crookneck Lake.

3. Open Discussion about the Project and Water Levels

- Dave felt that there was a 100% correlation the water levels of the two lakes, and believes that the Crookneck Lake water level will go down as Shamineau water level is reduced. He also noted that the Bay in Crookneck Lake will be negatively affected since the current lake owners like the current depth of the bay.
- There was discussion about shoreline erosion on both lakes and Dan noted that he felt that the fallen trees on Crookneck were from muskrats. He also thought the lake owners were OK with fixing their own property.
- The Crookneck LID stated that they want to make sure that Shamineau is taking Crookneck issues into their planning.
- There was discussion about how Crookneck communicates with their approximate 130 – 140 property owners. They reported that meetings, their website and newsletters were their primary communication strategies.
- Dan reported that their LID Annual meeting is August 18th and they will mail out their notice for the meeting around July 15th.
- There was also discussion about confusion with the high water project including confusion about the amount of water that will be pumped and to what levels; confusion over the route; and whether there is planned work with drainage from co rd. 203 and co rd. 3. Dan also stated that Crookneck does not like the Lake Lena route since they have concerns that it may cause seepage from the Landfill to Crookneck Lake of hazardous material that may still exist in the soil.

4. Next Steps

- The LSLID asked whether the Crookneck Board could provide a letter of support. Dan responded that they could not provide a letter of support until they received more information.
- There was discussion regarding the intent of the LSLID Board to send out a newsletter in June to Crookneck Lake Owners with clarifying information on the project. Dan stated that he is collecting questions regarding the Lake Shamineau project from Crookneck lake owners and he would forward them to the LSLID Board to include in the newsletter.
- Dan stated that he planned to send out his newsletter in mid-July which may also include an update on the Shamineau project, and if needed, attendance by the LSLID Board at their August meeting. He also wondered if surveying the Crookneck Lake owners may be a needed step.
